

<b>TIMELINE – Morag Davies</b>		
<b>July 13, 1988</b>		Morag DAVIES purchases home on Retlaw Dr., Sarnia. She resides alone.
<b>July 28, 1988</b>		Movers move Ms. Davies' belongings from her Errol Rd. apartment to her new home on Retlaw.
<b>August 20, 1988</b>	07:00	Morag DAVIES drives to Miller Lake (Bruce Peninsula) with real estate clients.
<b>August 21, 1988</b>	Evening hours	Morag DAVIES has co-worker at her home for dinner. The co-worker leaves to go on a date.
<b>August 22, 1988</b>		Monday – Morag DAVIES at work – Canada Trust Realty – 270 N. Christina St., Sarnia
<b>August 22, 1988</b>	10:00 (approx.)	Morag DAVIES and some other real estate agents drive together to inspect a property at Blue Point. On their way back to Sarnia they stop and have coffee in Brights Grove, as did the rest of the realtors on this inspection.
<b>August 22, 1988</b>	14:00	Morag DAVIES at her office. She speaks on the phone for about five minutes with a reporter of the Sarnia Observer regarding an article on real estate he is preparing.
<b>August 22, 1988</b>	19:00	Clients meet with Morag DAVIES at Canada Trust Realty office, 270 N. Christina St., Sarnia regarding some real estate listings. The clients left about 8:00 p.m.
<b>August 22, 1988</b>	21:00	Morag Davies is at home. She receives a call from a local merchant regarding an appliance she had purchased (clothes drier). Arrangements were made for delivery of these appliances on Wednesday, August 24, 1988 at about 8:00 p.m.
<b>August 23, 1988</b>		Tuesday – Morag DAVIES at work - Canada Trust Realty – 270 N. Christina St., Sarnia.
<b>August 23, 1988</b>	10:00 – 10:30	Morag DAVIES attends real estate inspection of house on Webster St.. She stayed for about 30 minutes. While she is there a realtor from her firm (one of the co-workers who would discover her remains on August 25, 1988) came in and spoke with her.
<b>August 23, 1988</b>	11:00	Ms. DAVIES meets with a man she had been seeing at a Mitton Street restaurant. They were together there for about 45 minutes. They discuss their affair, and according to the man, he tells her the affair is over.
<b>August 23, 1988</b>	12:30 – 13:00	Morag DAVIES attends a business at Oak Acres Plaza, Cathcart Blvd., Sarnia.
<b>August 23, 1988</b>	14:00	Morag DAVIES is at her home for an appointment with furnace/heating repairman.
<b>August 23, 1988</b>	16:00	The male who had met earlier with Ms. Davies at 11:00 a.m. calls Morag DAVIES from payphone near Zeller's Plaza. He discusses his doctor's appointment results (from an appointment he had earlier this afternoon). This is the last time this male states he spoke with Morag DAVIES.
<b>August 23, 1988</b>	17:00 (approximately)	A prospective out-of-town client walks in to Canada Trust Realty and meets with Ms. DAVIES re: properties. (This was a random office visit and the client and Ms. DAVIES did not know each other.)
<b>August 23, 1988</b>	18:00-18:30	Morag DAVIES calls a client on phone from her office. They discuss houses for five minutes.
<b>August 23, 1988</b>	18:30-19:30	Morag DAVIES leaves Canada Trust office and goes to Eaton's Mall – now known as Bayside Mall (150 N. Christina) to make payments on a bill. She tells receptionist at real estate office she will not be back, and to call her at home or page her if anything came in.
<b>August 23, 1988</b>	20:00-20:30	A client receives phone call from Morag DAVIES regarding properties in Petrolia. Ms. DAVIES advises she will call back on Wednesday.
<b>August 23, 1988</b>	21:00-23:00	Female co-worker visits with Morag DAVIES at her Retlaw Drive residence. (This co-worker is one of the people who discovered Ms. Davies' remains on August 25, 1988). Co-worker leaves at about 23:00. <b>This is the last Morag Davies is accounted for alive.</b>
<b>August 24, 1988</b>	04:30 – 04:40	London Free Press delivered to Morag Davies' residence. (This edition of the London Free Press is found outside victim's front door on August 25, 1988 by police, as well as the August 25, 1988 edition).
<b>August 24, 1988</b>		Wednesday – Morag DAVIES does not show up for work
<b>August 24, 1988</b>	20:30	Local merchant delivers portable drier to Morag DAVIES' residence. There was no answer at the front door. They went to garage door which was open six to eight inches. They opened the door further and saw her car in the garage. Wednesday's (August 24) London Free Press was at the front door. They left.
<b>August 25, 1988</b>	12:00 – 12:30	Two co-workers attend Morag Davies' residence. They discover Morag DAVIES' body in bedroom. They leave and go to one of their residences, which is a five to ten minute drive from Morag Davies home..
<b>August 25, 1988</b>	13:00 – 13:15	Clerk at St. Joseph's Hospital gets a call from co-worker who discovered body of Morag Davies. They asked for ambulance to Morag Davies' residence. The caller asked hospital clerk to notify police as well.
<b>August 25, 1988</b>	13:19 – 13:22	Sarnia Police and Sarnia Ambulance arrive at Morag Davies' residence. They gain entry by way of unlocked front door. Ms. Davies' body is located by ambulance and police, and the investigation is commenced. The August 25 edition of London Free Press is also at the front door.

**Cause of Death:**

Multiple stab wounds

**Clothing:**

When Ms. Davies was last seen alive on August 23, 1988 at about 11:00 p.m. she was wearing day clothes. She was wearing bedclothes at the time of her death.

**Status of Crime Scene:**

There was no sign of forced entry to the residence.

The front door was unlocked when police attended. It was described as a “sticky” door, in that it stuck in the door jamb due to humidity. The co-workers who discovered Ms. Davies’ body entered the residence through the garage and into the kitchen via an entry door from the garage. This door was found unlocked as well.

**Suspect:**

We know the assailant is a male.

The assailant may have been known to Ms. Davies. This is based on the fact there is no sign of forced entry into the residence. Further a witness came forward who reported to have been walking past Ms. Davies’ residence late in the evening of August 23, 1988, sometime after 11:00 p.m. This witness reports hearing a man and a woman arguing inside Ms. Davies’ residence.

Statistically, in most homicides, the assailant and victim are known to each other in some fashion.

**Morag Davies:**

At the time of her death, Morag Davies was 45 years-old. She had been a real estate agent for approximately three years at this point. Prior to her real estate career, Ms. Davies had been a registered nurse.

Ms. Davies was originally from Scotland. She came to Canada in the early 1970’s.

Ms. Davies was divorced, and had no children.
